Joe Halbur Scholarship

As of December the amount in the Joe Halbur Scholarship money market account was \$7993.21. This account was changed from a CD to a money market account during this 2010 year. The fall fundraiser raised \$1612.72. The sale of naturalist t-shirts, canvas totes, along with the silent and live auction, Extreme Naturalist Challenge and photo ID contest, were used to raise money for the fund. The scholarship amount awarded is \$500. Amy Holley, majoring in Conservation Management at Upper Iowa, was selected as this year's recipient.

Cari Burnstedt, Henry Co, continues her position as the webmaster. This year Burnstedt added a standard form for everyone to use when submitting changes for the site. A flash drive was purchased to save the originals of documents uploaded to the site for better organization and to aid in making changes at any time.
